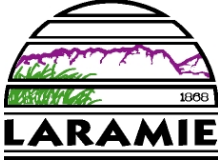

Title: EAC CAPA Boundary Letter and Environmental Concerns List

Administrative or Policy Goal:

Using their combined expertise and interest in the environmental field, the Environmental Advisory Committee (EAC) shall analyze assigned issues, receive and analyze citizen concerns and complaints, formulate options and advise the City Council and the Board of County Commissioners.

Background:

Several members of the joint City/County EAC have extensive knowledge in the geosciences. They would like to offer their combined expertise to study the western boundary of the Casper Aquifer Protection Area. This could be used to determine if the current western boundary in the Casper Aquifer Protection Plan truly represents the recommended 75-foot thickness of Satanka Shale overlying the Casper Aquifer.

In addition, the EAC would like to generate a list of environmental concerns that that could potentially be addressed. These environmental concerns, which need not be related to the Casper Aquifer, would help to provide the EAC with direction and allow them to pursue meaningful projects for the benefit of elected officials and the community.

City of Laramie and Albany County Environmental Advisory Committee

Dear members of the Laramie City Council,

The members of the Environmental Advisory Committee have become aware that the line marking where there is 75 feet of overlying Satanka Fm. that was developed to inform placement of the western boundary of the Casper Aquifer Protection Area is imprecise and inaccurate in some places. We feel that the location of this line is a science question, that an updated and more accurate determination of the 75 ft. is possible, and that a more accurate line could be helpful for any future decision making regarding CAPP updates, regulations, etc.

We are not advocating that the current CAPA boundaries be moved. That is a policy issue. We are simply offering to apply our technical expertise to updating the location of the 75-ft line so that it is available for your use as you see fit. Since the original 75-ft line was drafted back in 1999, there have been additional wells drilled, additional mapping has been completed by the Wyoming State Geological Survey, and surface geophysical studies have become available. Thus, the science on which the line was drawn has been advanced and the line can be re-drawn with this additional information.

So, we (i.e. the EAC) are proposing to spearhead the effort to update and more accurately determine the 75 ft. line for future use by City planning efforts. To put some draft words to this potential assignment, for your consideration: "The EAC is asked to proceed to apply their scientific expertise to providing a more accurate location of the "75 ft." line that has been used in development of Casper Aquifer protection plans. This line should represent the most eastward location west of which they are reasonably confident there is at least 75 feet of Satanka Fm. shale overlying the Casper Aquifer."

We wish to emphasize that we are not seeking to make policy regarding aquifer protection, only to provide you the best available scientific information to inform your development of appropriate policy and regulation as you feel best serves your constituents' interests. We look forward to hearing your wishes in this regard.
