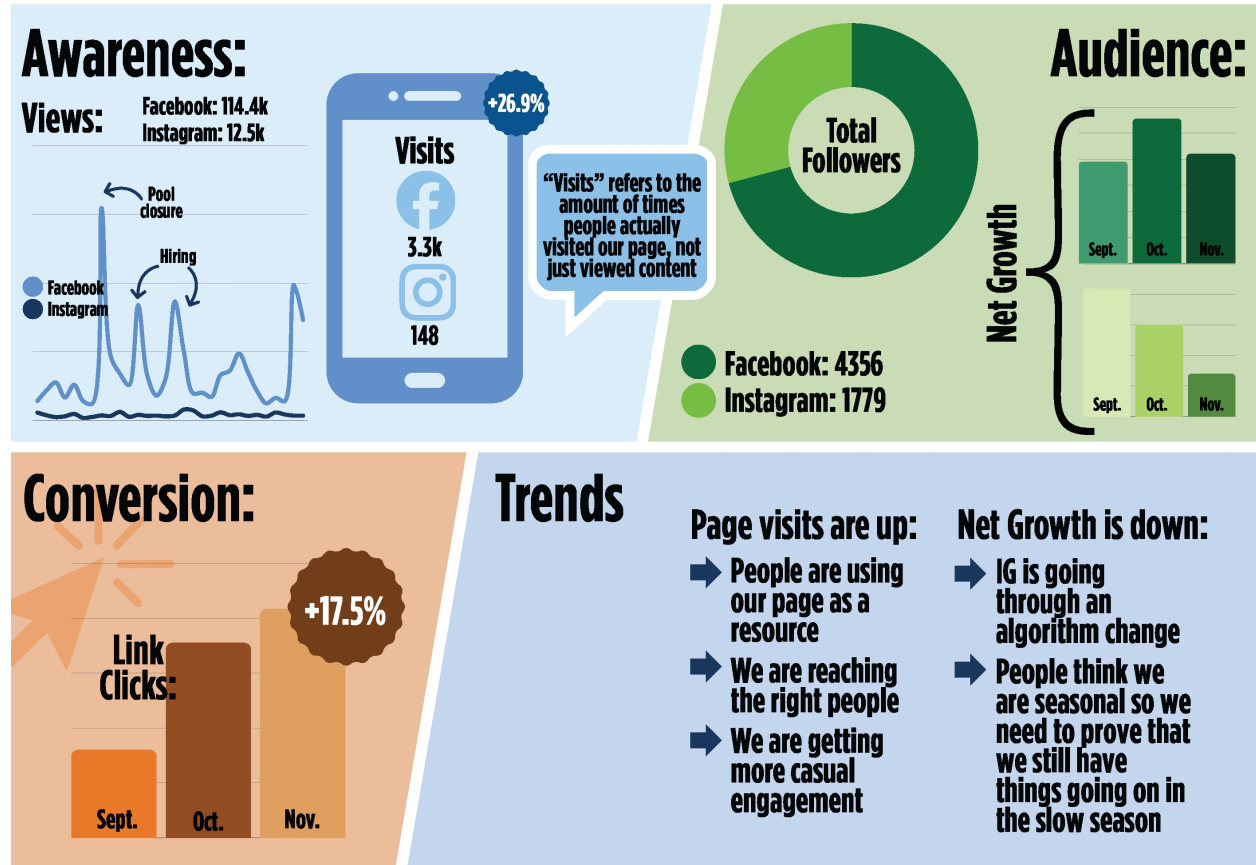

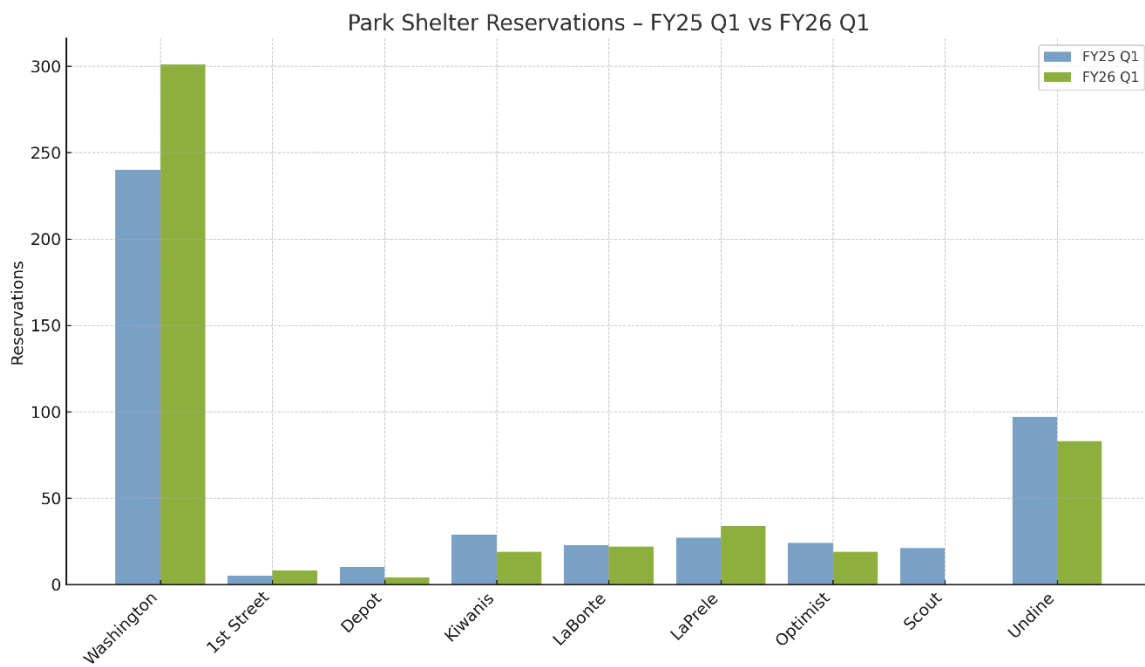
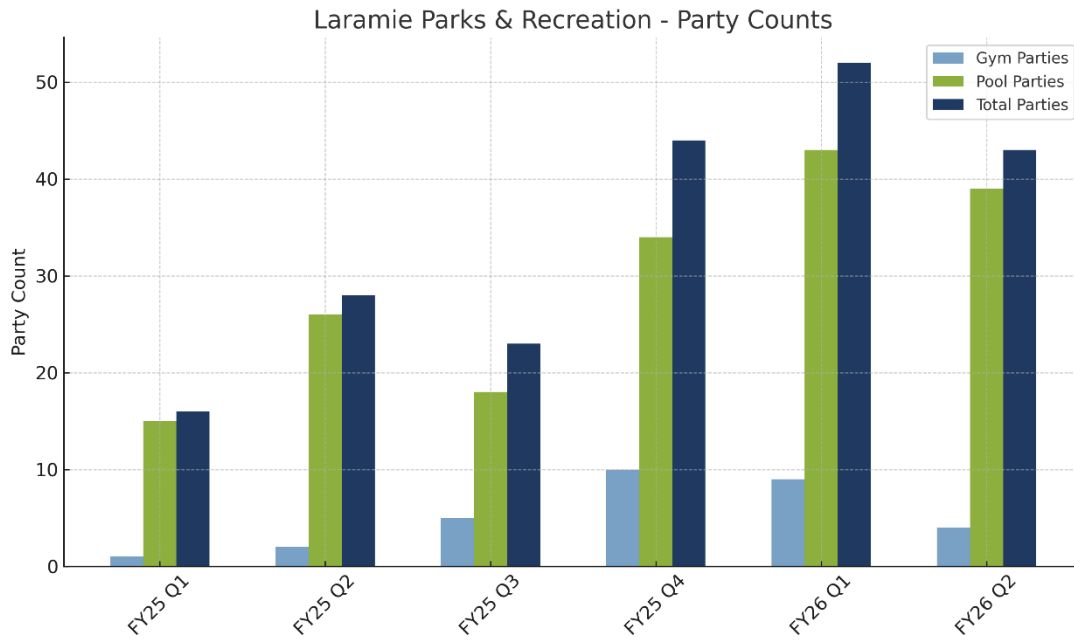

Through this last year we have implemented many changes and efficiencies and though we are still working towards this effort, we're able to share we've seen an increase in our Birthday Parties reservations and Parks

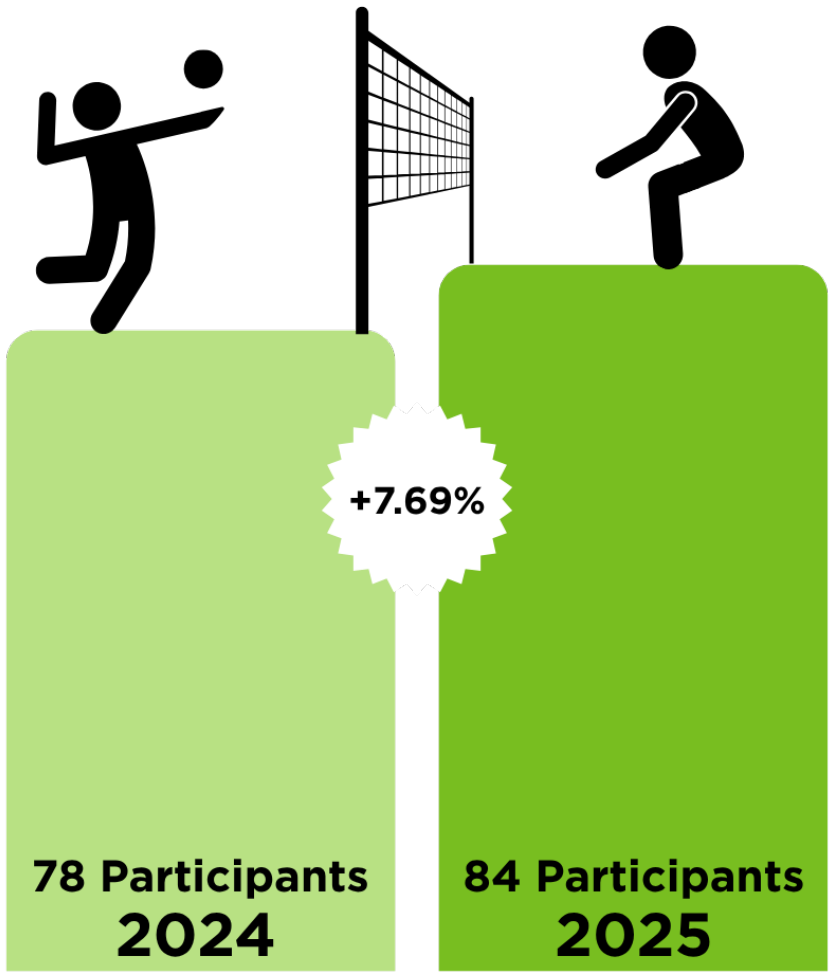

Adventure Kids half day and full day options are offered when Albany County School District does not have school in session such as for Parent-Teacher Conferences, in-services or teacher development days.

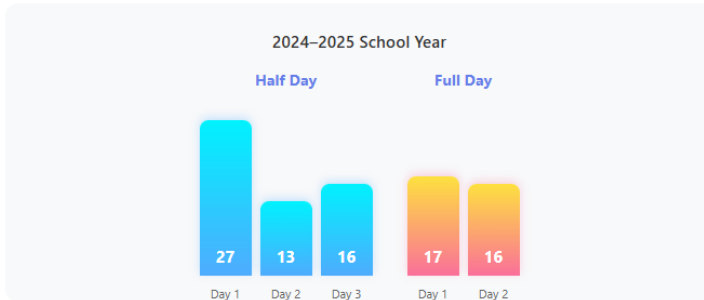


PROGRAM OVERVIEW

👤 Attendance (First Few Days)



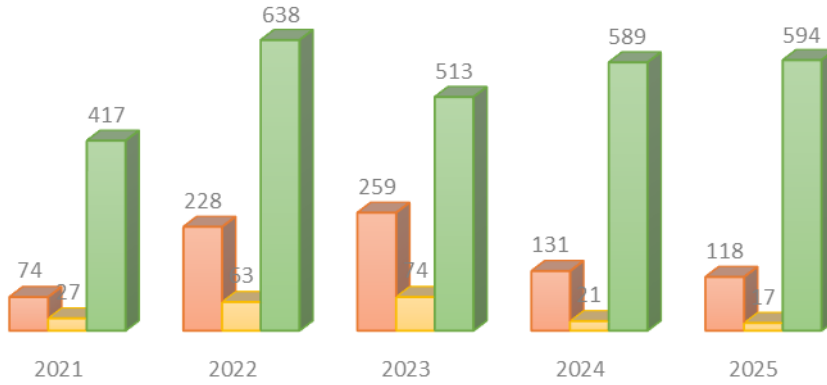
■ Half Day ■ Full Day

Aquatics:

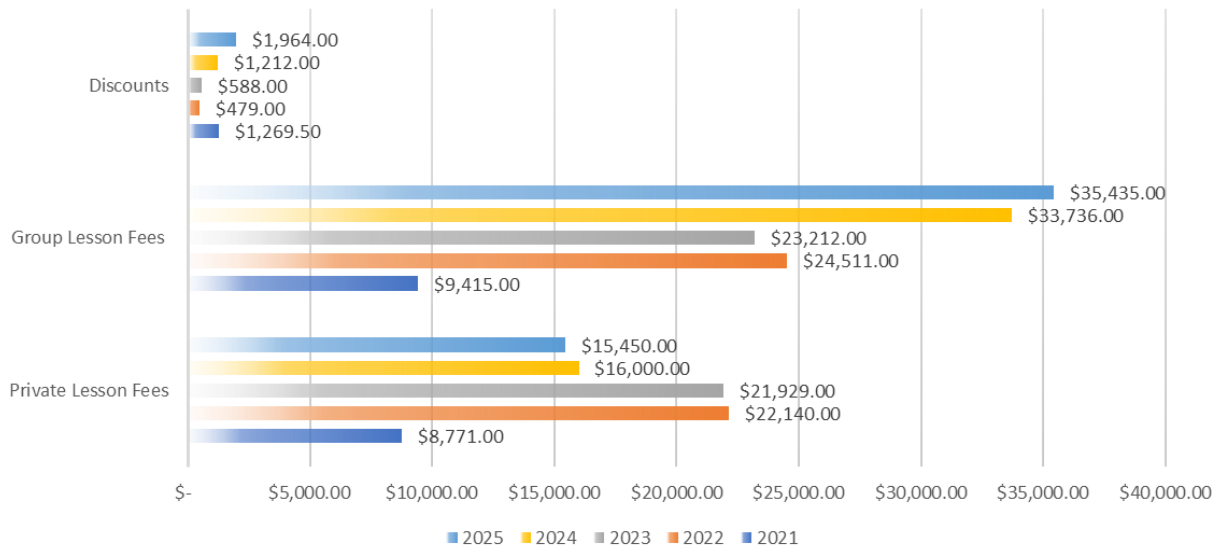

Parks/Cemetery/Forestry/Mosquito/IPM Report **(Scott Hunter, Parks Manager)**

Greenhill Cemetery:

- The cemetery conducted 11 burials in October, 9 cremains and 2 full size burial.
 - Four (4) over time funerals were scheduled through October 2025.
 - All receipts have not been received for funeral services. Payments of Ten (10) funerals through funeral homes have not been received yet.
- The cemetery irrigation has been winterized.
- Block 13 is being laid out for sales.
- The Jewish Community is looking for more cemetery plots for their congregation. Cemetery staff is working to find suitable locations.

Parks:

- Parks staff removed equipment from LaPrele playground and is waiting on parts.
- Shade structures were taken down for the winter.
- Softball and Baseball practices are slowing down, staff continues to prep fields for fall sports.
- Staff worked with Planning to remove the downtown parklet for the winter.
- Staff repaired the fence along the greenbelt behind the Murdochs distribution center.
- All irrigation systems and restrooms have been winterized for the season.
- Staff installed a culvert along the soft trail at Rotary Park.
- Staff has submitted the LWCF reimbursement paperwork to the LWCF State office and is awaiting confirmation of completion of project.

Mosquito Control:

- Mosquito Numbers have dropped off considerably and traps have been removed from their locations. Staff is reviewing each trap and has begun repairing those that are getting toward the end of their life.
- Mosquito Equipment is being cleaned and removed for the winter.
