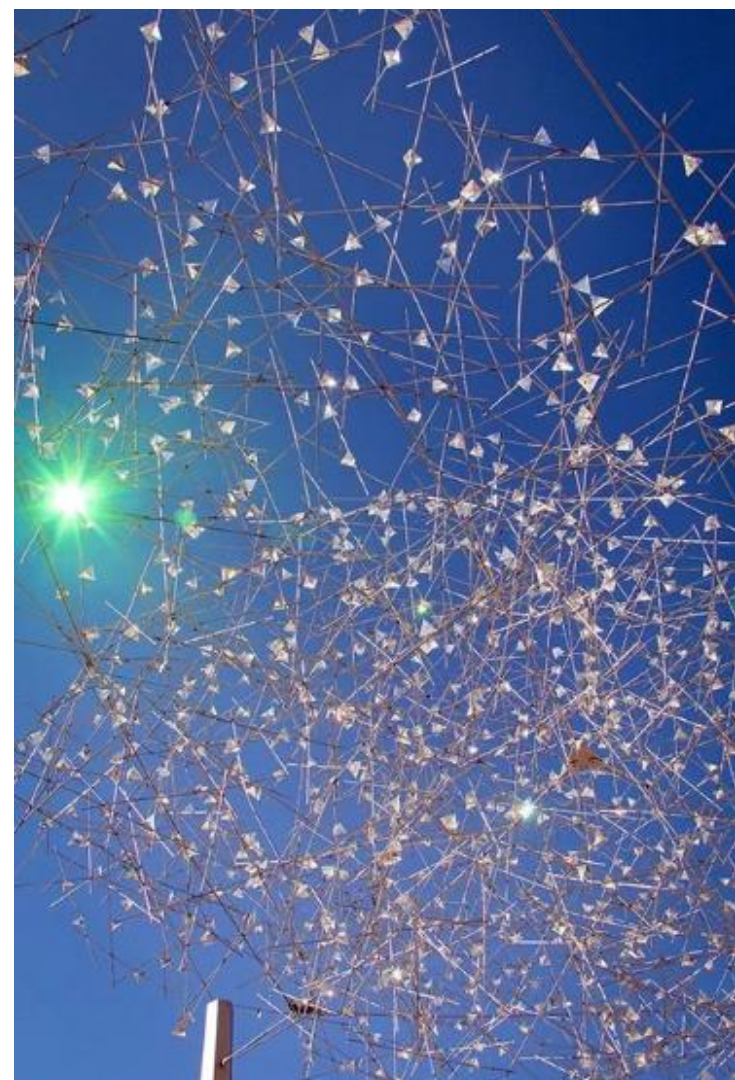

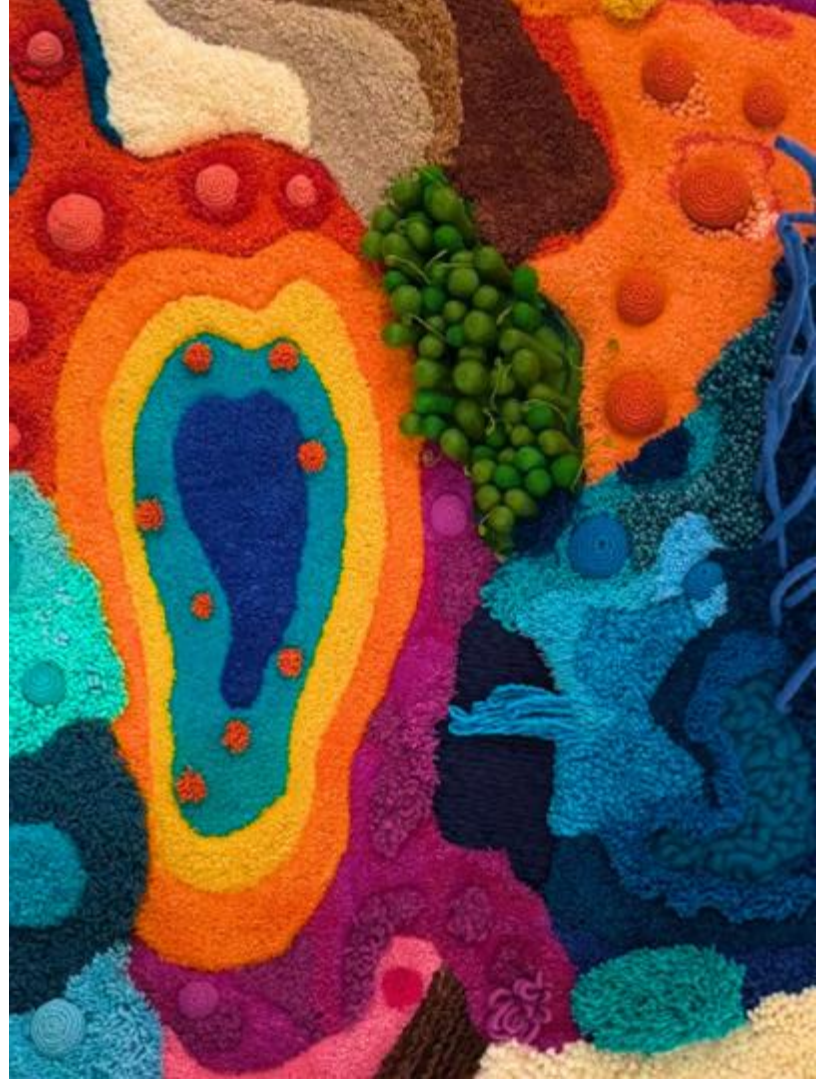
3rd Street Beautification

The first steps of a multi-year project in the making were made this past year when the artist team, HaddadDrugan (Laura Haddad and Tom Drugan) were selected from a pool of applicants to create gateway artwork for the 3rd Street Corridor. A local committee interviewed five outstanding applicants to select the artist team. The City of Laramie and WYDOT were able to complete much needed work on the strip of road with future art coming soon. Since their selection, Haddad and Drugan have visited twice and met with constituents and stakeholders of the project to begin developing an artwork that honors our community.



Creative Aging

With a grant received from the Wyoming Arts Council, we were able to hire local artists, Rocio Gomez-Sandoval and Alex Ewing, to lead participants in eight weeklong courses to develop new skills. Alex Ewing taught a ceramics course. Gomez-Sandoval created the curriculum and taught a variety of textile techniques to the 55+ group of participants. These processes were then employed to create final works of art, both public and private.



Laramie Jubilee Days[®] Banners

In collaboration with Laramie Jubilee Days[®] and the City of Laramie, LPAC was able to bring the work of 20+ artists to the streets of Laramie with light pole banners. These banners were designed by Laramie-based artists and provide an opportunity for these artists to enter the field of public art.



Artist-led Workshops

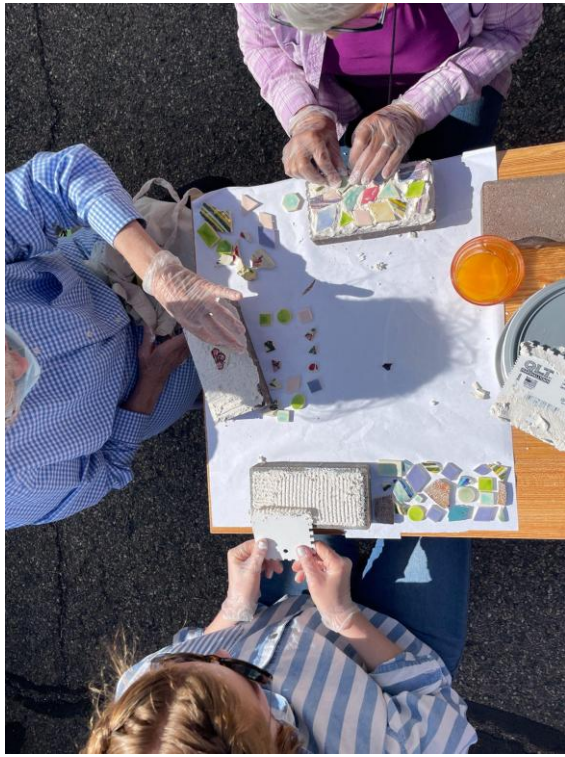
Laramie Public Art Coalition continued to work with local artists to bring our ever-popular and affordable artist workshops to the public. These workshops ranged in topic and time frame. Community members participated in a 4-week knitting and natural dye workshop, a morning of flower arranging, a 2-day willow basket weaving intensive, and more. Over 100 community members participated in our workshops, learning new skills and engaging with each other during these sessions. We are proud to employ the many talented artists in our region to share their skills and knowledge with the community.
