

Albany County and City of Laramie Community Partner Organization Funding Request Application FY2027

The City of Laramie and Albany County provide funding to local community partner organizations through their annual budget making processes. Organizations receiving these funds do not operate within the formal structure of city or county governments but may utilize support from these governments to achieve their missions or fund special projects. Community partner organizations generally have a strong presence within the community and provide vital services, products, or activities that serve to improve the community in a variety of ways. Only non-profit/not-for-profit entities are eligible to apply for funding. For-profit entities are ineligible.

Historically, organizations requesting funding fall within the following three categories:

Recreational/Arts and Culture: These organizations exist to promote, sustain, and develop recreational, cultural, and leisure activities within the community. These organizations may also sponsor educational and community events and celebrations designed to encourage a diverse cultural and active lifestyle while promoting a strong sense of community.

Social Services: The primary objective of these organizations is to support or engage in activities designed to enhance the wellbeing of individuals and families within the community. These organizations provide a variety of services that focus on basic human needs, access to programs and services designed to maintain human dignity and health, and the overall welfare of citizens.

Civic Organizations/Quasi-Governmental: These organizations have been established within our community to A) work for the overall improvement, advancement, and economic health through civic involvement, economic development initiatives, and fostering community spirit; or B) provide services, programs and other opportunities for the betterment of the community through the organization of Joint Powers Boards or other Quasi-Governmental Organizations that work collaboratively with the City of Laramie and/or Albany County on shared goals, concerns, and interests.

This Community Partner Funding is available from funds collected via Albany County's 5th Penny Tax and historically has funded approximately \$250,000 in County requests and \$235,000 in City requests. In their sole discretion, the City and County each reserve the right to waive any informality in any application and/or reject any application.

Organizations can submit a request to both the City and County. If an organization is awarded funding, the organization is solely responsible for its costs including, but not limited to, operations, personnel, taxes,

maintenance, and insurance coverage against public liability and property damage.

Priority of requests is as follows:

- Requests that improve the community.
- Requests that are not more than 20% of organization's general operating budget and do not exceed \$20,000 each from City or County.
- Requests to either City or County that are less than 20% of organization's general operating budget but in excess of \$20,000 are considered on a case by case basis and may affect the priority of the organization's request.
- Demonstration of multiple revenue sources for organization.
- The number of people served by organization.
- Clear identification of those who benefit from the organization's work.
- Demonstration of the organization's partnership with other organizations in the community.
- Requests that do not duplicate efforts already existing in the community.

For-profit entities are not eligible to apply. Only non-profit/not-for-profit entities are eligible to apply for funding.

Schedule for Decision Making Process and Availability of Funds:

City: Laramie City Council intends to make its preliminary funding decisions in early to mid-April 2026 and final funding decisions will be announced upon adoption of the City's FY2026/2027 Budget in June 2026. The City's award payments to successful organizations will be made on or around August 1, 2026, pending receipt of the fully executed agreement.

County: The Albany County Commissioners make their final funding decisions upon the adoption of the County's FY2026/2027 Budget in June 2026. Agreements will be sent to successful organizations in July 2026. Pending the County's receipt of the fully executed Agreement, the County's award payments to successful organizations will only be made on a reimbursement basis.

All information on this form and all requested documentation must be complete and submitted before the application will be considered. Applications that are incomplete or are missing required materials may be rejected. The grant request submitted to Albany County and City of Laramie Community Partner Organization Funding for FY2027 is for quality-of-life improvements at the Hospice of Laramie facility and for the patients under our care. Hospice provides end-of-life care in both the six-bed inpatient facility and out in the community (patients' homes, nursing home, and assisted living).

Presently, the kitchen is stocked with appliances, cookware, and tableware's that have been generously donated from individuals over the ~10 years that the Hospice House has been open. While the Hospitality Specialist (the employee who prepares the weekly meals) has made do; streamlined, commercial quality items would provide increased food safety, ease of preparation, and overall improved appearance of the kitchen facilities.

This grant will specifically cover eight (8) different areas aimed at improving the quality of life for the Hospice of Laramie team and the patients served. These eight areas include kitchen equipment, cookware, prep ware, tableware, kitchen accessories, adaptive supplies, outside spaces, and miscellaneous. In the creation of these categories, staff made a full inventory of current kitchen supplies and determined a reasonable list of items needing replacement. From there, high quality and highly rated replacements were determined and that is what has been quoted as part of this grant application.

While it would be possible to go line by line the purchases that Hospice of Laramie intends to make if awarded this grant (please see Project Budget for line-item view), all the items will provide value added to patient experience in the Hospice House facility and to patients in the community. Melamine dinnerware provides unbreakable food safe eating surfaces, lidded plastic tumblers provide spill proof drinking, adaptive tools promote prolonged independence, outdoor upgrades provide beautification and safe outdoor spaces to be enjoyed, battery powered essential oil diffusers provide comfort, and luggage hand trucks make facility move in and supply deliveries easier for patient families and staff.

All these items will go a long way in improving the quality of life for the staff employed at Hospice of Laramie and the patients that are served here. Whether through a homemade meal in the hospice kitchen, supporting independent eating for an individual, or giving space to enjoy the outside these items provide comfort, joy, and harmony to the Hospice House facility.

With this grant funding, Hospice of Laramie hopes to see a benefit to three areas. Patient autonomy, safety of the facility, and ease/quality of food preparation. Patient autonomy and support of desires are areas that hospice works to support during a patient's journey. Desire to continue being able to feed themselves, drink their own beverages, and communicate with family and friends are all common themes the staff see among patients. While it is clear how adaptive supplies (silverware, bowls/plates, and cups) might provide this, even unbreakable traditional plates can provide a huge amount of dignity and self sufficiency to patients. Bright colored plates that aren't tan or white are also important as the food is easier to see and are enjoyed by those with visual impairment. The safety of the facility will mainly be improved with new cookware, prep ware, and supplies. By seeking out commercial kitchen quality, items should have a long-life span and stackable items reduce risks of falling out of the cabinets or clogging drawers. It is a goal of Hospice of Laramie to keep the kitchen inviting but also maintain food safety and ease of use. Lastly, by making food prep easier with items like prep bowls that fit needs, the quality of the food can be increased and maintained by decreasing time to accomplish tasks, provide safe and reasonable tools for each job, and suitable serving solutions. It would be the goal of Hospice of Laramie to complete all purchases and upgrades within sixty (60) days of grant award to get these quality-of-life upgrades into place as quickly as possible.

Hospice of Laramie has numerous partnerships in the community that provide value to patients and their families. Non-profits organizations including the Laramie Soup Kitchen (provides food items to supplement in house meals for patients), Eppson Center (a partner in DME 'rental' and storage), Laramie Interfaith (commonly referenced to patients/families by a social worker), Wyoming 211 (assistance with referrals and a common resource for social work), and United Way (Hospice of Laramie is a proud partner agency) provide immeasurable value to our patients/families and staff who rely on these services for resources and references when working with families. Additionally, Hospice of Laramie works with Laramie Health and Rehab, Spring Wind Assisted Living, Ivinson Hospital, Regency Retirement Community, Downtown Clinic, and local doctors' offices for referrals to hospice care and support through that journey. Hospice of Laramie is also supported by a strong team of community volunteers who do a variety of tasks including making meals, talking with patients, skilled volunteer work (PT/OT, Pharmacist, Nutritionist), playing the piano or other music, and cleaning/tidying around the facility or in patients' homes. A special partnership is one shared with Developmental Preschool. As next-door neighbors, Hospice has been fortunate to work with Developmental Preschool to provide opportunities for joy, learning, and laughter. Events like easter egg hunts, Halloween trick-or-treating, and holiday singing have provided so much value to Hospice's patients and staff.
