Liquor License Renewals

- **5.09.100 - License—Required**

- No person shall sell, offer for sale, traffic in or deliver for value, or in any other way than purely gratuitously, any alcoholic or malt liquor in the city without a license therefor.
- (Ord. 1511 § 9, 2007; Ord. No. 1763 , § 1, 6-4-2019)

- **5.09.105 - Application for licenses and permits.**

- A. Each applicant for a license under this chapter shall, at the time of filing his application, pay the city clerk a sum sufficient to cover the costs of publishing notice. Any person desiring to sell, keep for sale or offer for sale alcoholic or malt beverages shall make application to the city council, which application shall be made upon the form furnished by the city and the applicant must comply with the provisions of W.S. 12-4-102. The application shall be filed with the city clerk. All statements made in the application shall be sworn to by the applicant and shall meet the requirements set forth by state law and applicable city ordinances.

Retail Liquor Licenses Exceptions

- **LMC 5.09.615 —Prohibited on licensed premises—
General Exceptions.**

A. No licensee (or the licensee's employee or agent) shall knowingly permit anyone under 21 years of age to enter or remain in the licensed building where alcoholic or malt beverages are dispensed unless:

5. The establishment is operating a restaurant and the primary source of revenue (greater than 50% of revenue) of the operation is from the sale of food. Further:
 - a) In calculating the percentage of a licensee's revenue attributable to sale of food and sale of alcoholic and/or malt beverages, the licensee's revenue from alcoholic and/or malt beverages sold off-premises pursuant to an Alcohol Catering Permit shall not be included in the calculation; and

Alcohol Violation Data

- Of a total of 950 reportable incidents relating to alcohol serving establishments (i.e.- retail distribution, bars, etc.), over a roughly year period, only 8 total Point System violations were recorded.
- Data was compiled and compared from a several documents:
 - “Alcoholic Beverage Violation Points Assessment Report”
 - “Raw Data 010120-111020” (Covering period of 01/01/20 to 11/10/20)
 - “Raw Data 111020-123120” (Covering period of 11/10/20 to 12/31/20)
- Data switch over occurred in between system overhaul/new system.

Alcohol Server Training & Tavern Meetings

Alcohol Server Training

- Required by LMC 5.09.105.G
 - *“Each licensee and all managers, supervisory personal, and all persons who will be selling, serving, or managing the sale of alcoholic beverages employed at the licensed premises...” must complete training ... “...within 90 days of employment.”*

Tavern Meetings

One Tavern meeting was held on December 17, 2020.

- Required by LMC 5.09.105.H
 - *“Each licensee or their designated representative are required to attend two tavern meetings per license year prior to the renewal of their license. Tavern meetings [are] to be noticed and organized by the city. Failure to comply with this section is subject to a violation of the point system as outlined in L.M.C. 5.09.800.”*
- Asking for an exception from LMC this year due to COVID-19 restrictions.
